Family Medicine Residency Program

Halifax Health - Family Medicine Residency Program is one of the oldest family medicine residency programs in the State of Florida, and one of the longest standing programs in the country. The fully accredited Family Medicine Residency Program is affiliated with the University of South Florida College of Medicine. The Centers for Family and Sports Medicine are rich educational environments thanks to a diverse patient population, over 17,000 patient visits per year, up-to-date procedural equipment, and a collegial office environment where residents and faculty see patients side-by-side.

The Program

The Family Medicine Externship Program for third and fourth year medical students is a flexible rotation providing clinical exposure to various aspects of family medicine. Length of externship and assignments are arranged on an individual basis to best accommodate the needs of each student.



Externs are encouraged to take advantage of the full range of family medicine educational experiences available at Halifax Health. Under the supervision of faculty and

residents, externs enjoy direct outpatient care opportunities in our Centers for Family and Sports Medicine and also experience inpatient services - adult medicine, perinatal care, and child/adolescent care - from a family practice perspective. Regular didactic sessions - AM Report, Noon Conference, Grand Rounds, Sports Medicine Conference, Cardiology, and others - are available to supplement the clinical experience. Externs may assist our Sports Medicine Fellow in seasonal coverage of athletic events and/or accompany faculty and residents to a nearby homeless shelter serving those in need.



Faculty

Our full and part-time faculty members are dedicated teachers who enjoy working with medical students. Several faculty members have developed regional and national reputations as lecturers in sports medicine, lower endoscopy, women's health, obesity, herbal medicine, bioethics, cross-cultural medicine, skin procedures, community medicine, joint injections, etc. Faculty members see themselves as life-long learners and have established a collegial environment that encourages information sharing in a supportive, non-competitive fashion.

Application and Appointment

Applicants must be a fourth year medical student in good standing in an LCME approved medical school. Applicants must provide a statement of professional liability coverage, Dean's letter of reference, latest copy of transcripts, and USMLE scores, if applicable. Housing is available on a limited basis. Meals are provided while on duty. There is no salary or transportation stipend.

Halifax Health
